Originated within the Department of Hispanic Studies at Brown University with the aim of fostering connections with the vibrant communities involved in the creation, education, and appreciation of art and literature in Rhode Island. FLIP 2024 is scheduled to unfold from April 5th to 7th, spanning across venues at Brown University, the city of Providence, and its surroundings.

Inspired by the rise of a remarkable constellation of <u>influential and award-winning</u> <u>writers</u>, FLIP is thrilled to welcome novelists, poets, and short story writers from Latin America, the Caribbean, and Spain to join us at Brown University and in Providence.

FLIP aims to serve as a bridge, connecting our vibrant campus with the heart of the city and nurturing a strong sense of community. To foster inclusivity and knowledge across diverse backgrounds and age groups, the festival will host discussions featuring novelists, translators, publishers, and poets, performances, and a series of <u>workshops</u> for all members of the Brown University community and the wider local community, including children and teens, who will be able to enjoy a specific set of activities in the context of our <u>Mini FLIP</u>.

The theme of this inaugural edition is "<u>Fuera de Lugar/Out of Place</u>." Through this notion, we seek to delve into the experience of living and creating in foreign environments, exploring the sense of displacement that resonates deeply with the international landscape of Brown University, Providence, and Rhode Island.
